We are very excited to announce that lodging at the SMU Girls Soccer Academy remains on the campus of SMU! All rooms are newly renovated and have air conditioning. Located near the SMU Soccer Fields, the rooms are very comfortable and will be an extremely safe and efficient venue. In addition to the coaching staff staying in the dorms, the SMU Girls Soccer Academy hires a staff to help monitor and supervise the rooms. Meals will be provided as usual in an all-you-can-eat format to ensure that every player's needs are met.

The camp fee includes all the meals that the players will eat during the week. However, many players like to purchase pizza or sports drinks as a snack after the evening session. Also available in the camp store is some of the latest soccer gear, so please make sure that campers are provided for appropriately.

AIRPORT TRANSPORTATION

Every major airline has flights into DFW and Southwest Airlines has flights into Love Field. SMU Soccer Academy has made arrangements to provide service for \$10 each way from Love Field, and \$15 each way from DFW. The SMU Soccer Academy recommends flying Southwest Airlines into Love Field. For those making flight reservations, check-in is from 2:30-4:00pm on Sunday afternoon and check-out is at 12:30pm on Thursday afternoon. For your convenience, please pay the driver at the time of pick-up. Be sure to notify us of your flight information by contacting Angie Erwin at smusoccer@smu.edu or at 214-385-5405 no later than seven (7) days before your camp starts. This will help us to confirm your arrival and departure times and ensure that your travel needs are met.

Medical care

Each camp will have a full-time trainer from the SMU Sports Medicine staff on duty to take care of all minor injuries. For more serious problems, the local hospital is just minutes away.

What to bring

Other than the normal amount of street clothes we suggest that you bring the following items: 1 pair of soccer shoes, 1 pair of indoor or turf shoes, 1 pair of tennis shoes, 6 t-shirts, 6 pairs of shorts, 8 pairs of socks, shin guards, other soccer type clothes, 1 swim suit, small bag or shoe bag, sandals, water container, toiletries including sun block, twin bed linens, a pillow and bath towels. Don't forget to bring your soccer ball if you do not plan on purchasing one from the camp store. Goalkeepers should bring gloves for the week, and normal training gear. Each goalkeeper should also have long sleeves and long pants just in case they are needed.

ACADEMY DAY CAMP

The SMU Women's Soccer Academy is now proud to offer day camps for local girls throughout the Dallas metroplex. Come join other children your own age in the beautiful and safe setting of the SMU campus. Girls will be placed in small groups, according to age and ability, to allow for more individualized attention from some of SMU's finest collegiate soccer players and staff. The Day Camp is open to all field players and goalkeepers and specializes in technique and skill development. The Day Camp is sure to be a fun and unique experience. COLLEGE SOCCER

Many of our older campers have aspirations to play soccer at the collegiate level. At the SMU Soccer Academy, we try to assist these players as much as possible by giving them insight into the recruiting process. This presentation is highly informative to the prospective student-athlete and is open to all parents. The presentation will conclude with an open question and answer segment.

COLLEGE PREP PROGRAM

In conjunction with our Residential Academy we will also have a College Prep Camp. The College Prep camp will be for girls ages 15-18. The camp will feature all of the normal amenities of residential camp but also provide exposure to college coaches from all around Texas and the US, extra mental conditioning training with Meagan Surrency, and the ability to play nightly games watched and coached by the college coaches on staff. The SMU Soccer Academy employs many college soccer coaches who can answer any questions the players may have during the week. The SMU College Prep camp will provide the player unique insight into the recruiting process, what coaches look for in recruitable players and a glimpse into the day to day life of a college soccer athlete.

MENTAL CONDITIONING

Here at SMU our players work regularly with mental conditioning coach Meagan Surrency to build and apply the mental skills that allow them to reach their goals and compete at their best each time they take the field. This year, campers will have the opportunity to work with Meagan to learn these same tools and techniques in order to further improve upon their game. Learning to win the mental game is essential for any young star to reach her potential!

ATHLETES' PERFORMANCE

Over the last decade, Athletes' Performance (AP) has developed a proprietary training methodology that centers upon four fundamentals:

Mindset, Nutrition, Movement, and Recovery.

The AP team has trained the last four #1 NFL Draft picks, 8 of last year's MLB All-Stars, and countless champions in the NBA, NFL, golf, soccer, and tennis. The SMU Goalkeeper Camp provides goalkeepers of all levels a challenging program that will drive them to excel. Designed and coached by SMU Goalkeeping Coach and KeeperZone Director Joe Waggoner, the SMU Goalkeeping School is widely recognized as one of the premier Goalkeeper training programs in the country.

Joe has coached top goalkeepers from North Texas and throughout the country. From 2001 – 2010, Joe was the Head Goalkeeper Coach in the North Texas ODP Program for all ages boys and girls. Joe has been on Regional Staff as a goalkeeper coach

with USYSA Region 3. Since 2000, Joe has run KeeperZone Goalkeeper Coaching and Education coaching State High School champions, NTSSA State Champions, USYSA Regional Champions, and USYSA National Champion Goalkeepers.

The camp program curriculum is designed to cover each aspect of the goalkeepers training and game play through the year from individual goalkeeper training to team training and into actual evening games. Joe and his staff of goalkeeper coaches and current and ex goalkeepers will be on the field with the campers during each aspect of their training through the week. The balanced curriculum is designed so that a goalkeeper coach can actively work in small group settings with each goalkeeper.

Academy Goalkeeper Residential Camp

The SMU Women's Soccer Academy is one of the premier soccer camps in the United States. Coach Brent Erwin, Coach Joe Waggoner and their dedicated staff of coaches have designed a top quality program for girls who have a strong desire to improve upon their understanding of the game and abilities as soccer players. The SMU campus and fields provide a one of a kind environment where players will participate in a challenging but fun week of soccer instruction. Players will be broken into small groups based on age and skill level to ensure campers receive the most individual attention possible. During the morning sessions, we will teach, correctly demonstrate and rehearse the skills needed to improve the player's technique. The afternoon session emphasizes tactical development in a game environment using small-sided activities. The evenings consist of nightly tournaments with full-sided games where the players are able to demonstrate the techniques and tactics learned during the day. At the SMU Soccer Academy, we strive to teach the campers not just skills, but the knowledge of how to use those skills in the game.
